



A successful visit to project AIDS Care

Inger Lise's trip to Chiang Mai in January was a very rewarding trip and gave good promises for the future.

From January 21. - February 5. Inger Lise visited the AIDS Care project in Chiang Mai, Northern Thailand.

The goal was to make a follow-up on the ministry in general and particularly to visit the Doi Law village area to meet many of the children and families AIDS Care supports and to investigate if there were further needs, where we could help.

At the same time the number of children AIDS Care supports were increased. We also had planned to employ a new worker in AIDS Care.

The visit showed, that Ang has a good control of the finances and that the cooperation with the administration at the Mekong Center works smooth and nice.

We have now planned to have a monthly meeting at the Mekong Center together with Monika Wunderli (Inger Lises successor). This will make the AIDS Care ministry more visible in the OMF fellowship.

Several days were used to visit the families in Doi Law, where we visited a number of families and they had a chance to meet Inger Lise.

Inger Lise also visited all the new children's families. Inger Lise had the clear impression that we are helping where the greatest needs are.

Inger Lise also visited a local school, where a number of AIDS Care children go to school. She had a good talk with the teacher and the local school headmaster. The visit underlined that there still are many children who are in need of help.

Inger Lise also employed a new worker, who will get the responsibility for the Sunday school and English teaching. A nice and positive girl, who we expected a lot from.

Unfortunately after 2 weeks she, due to personal problems, had to stop again and moved to Bangkok. A great disappointment for us all.

Please pray for a new worker to AIDS Care very fast - we are in great, great need.

Every Saturday we are having Sunday school and English teaching in 2 different places in Doi Law. Both places the 'class-room' is located under shadowing trees and with plastic as seating.

Every Saturday we gather between 40 to 60 children. One of the older girls has recently started studying the bible by correspondence.

All in all a very good and positive trip where we saw how important the AIDS Care ministry is for many people in this area.

The Sunday school at Daengs place gets better conditions.

The local village headman has offered AIDS Care that we can have the Sunday school at the local village sala.

A sala is a building with concrete floor and with a fixed roof. Normally the building is use for official village meetings.

We see this offer as an official accept and acknowledgment of the AIDS Care ministry in the area. ■



Project 'Bi-Cycle'

In our meeting with the local school we were told, that a number of the children have a need to some kind of transportation.

Several of the children has to go to/from school - some of the children up to several kilometers. This also makes it difficult for the children to participate in our Sunday school and English teaching.

The school has one bicycle which can be loaned for a shorter period (max. 6 months).

AIDS Care will try to find financial resources to buy a number of bicycles, which can be made available.

A bicycle cost appr. US\$ 60. Thank you for helping us to help. ■
